### FOR ADMISSION IN CLASS XI

**Eligibility :**

**For Science (PCM) :** a minimum of 75% marks in Science and Mathematics separately, in the written examination of X CBSE.

**For Science (PCB) :** a minimum of 70% marks in Science and Mathematics separately, in the written examination of X CBSE.

**For Commerce :** a minimum of 65% (overall) in written examination of X CBSE.

**For Humanities :** a minimum of 65% (overall) in written examination of X CBSE.
